18 Awards Totaling \$100,000 (Increase of \$10,000 over 2009-10)

alban elved dance company: \$7,000

To continue "Wingspan," a two- to six-week residency with high school dance departments in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools

Art Tasting: \$2,000

To lead interdisciplinary arts classes at The Children's Home that will provide students with the tools to explore their own creativity

Associated Artists of Winston-Salem: \$3,000

To conduct visual arts workshops led by practicing professional artists in public middle and high school classes, allowing teachers to enhance their current curriculum by introducing students to a specific art media

Carolina Ballet: \$6,000

To support their "Dancers in the Schools" program that brings ballet and professional dancers into the public schools, specifically targeting 3rd and 5th grades

Carolina Music Ways: \$4,400

To continue "Carolina Music Ways Old-Timey Radio Show," a 45-minute musical program that introduces elementary school students to the piedmont's cross-cultural musical legacy featuring jazz, blues, bluegrass, gospel Moravian, and old-time string bands

Giannini Brass: \$6,000

To present "Brass Under the Big Top" which integrates musical performances with the magic of the circus to expose elementary school students to classical music and teach music concepts and history

Diana Greene: \$3,520

To conduct a two-week literacy through photography workshop for 4th graders called "My Inside/Outside Self," in which students will make black and white self-portraits and write a narrative describing who they are on the inside and out

Hispanic Arts Initiative: \$3,000

To conduct Latin percussion and dance workshops in the public elementary and middle schools and to partner with Arts Based Elementary School in which students will write and perform an adaptation of Shakespeare's play called "Romeo & Juliet on the Border"

Karl Kassner: \$4,000

To provide small group instruction for public middle school brass students in order to enhance the students' understanding of how to play brass instruments

North Carolina Shakespeare Festival: \$5,400

To bring Shakespeare To Go's performances of Romeo & Juliet and A Midsummer Night's Dream to public middle and high schools in order to support the study of Shakespeare in the classroom

Piedmont Craftsmen: \$10,000

To present "Living Craft: Crafting Lives," a three-tiered craft program for elementary through high school students that includes a Craft Career Day, Artists in Residencies, and Fine Craft Lectures

RiverRun International Film Festival: \$2,000

To present "Films with Class," a program that brings the art of filmmaking into the classroom through viewing festival films and discussing its art and content

Robert Moyer: \$2,000

To celebrate National Poetry Month in April, by conducting a series of poetry workshops for 2nd through 5th grade students at Arts Based Elementary School in which students will write poems and perform for their peers

Southeastern Center for Contemporary Art: \$9,000

To support The Intersections Project (TIP), a collaborative program that brings together artists and classroom educators to develop arts integrated lesson plans and artist residencies for classroom application

Tam Tam Mandingue Winston-Salem: \$10,000

To bring hands-on African drumming and dancing workshops to the public K-12 students

The Healing Force: \$3,200

To present "The Rhythm of the Drum," a performance that celebrates West African culture through music and storytelling in the public K-12 schools

To bring student dancers from the School of Dance to present *Peter and the Wolf* in 4 elementary schools and professional alumni troupe, Open Dream Ensemble, to present *Peril on the Red Planet* in 3 elementary schools

To create and perform "Eternus Vita" (lat. Eternal Life), a work that will incorporate innovative real-time visual effects to enhance the performance experience in partnership with Salem College

Authoring Action: \$7,500

To create a "Glass Quilt," a public art piece based on a Manifesto written by Authoring Action youth in collaboration with artist Jan Detter and StoryLine

Center for Design Innovation: \$10,000

To support the Design, Art, & Technology Symposium (DATS 2010), "FOOD FOR THOUGHT: Nourish roots. Cultivate ideas. Harvest change!" which will explore how food-related creativity can help to develop a sustainable culture of healthy lifestyles through good eating

Old Salem Museums & Gardens: \$10,000

To support Art in Clay: Masterworks of North Carolina Earthenware, a two year project that will bring Old Salem's ceramic collection into the national spotlight via a touring exhibition, publications, online exhibition and database, educational symposia, and an arts festival

To pair 8 spoken word artists with local community groups to create socially relevant themes for slam competitions and to create a CD and chapbook from these slams

Reynolda House Museum of American Art: \$10,000

To support the collections database project, making over 1,500 objects from its fine art, decorative art, silver, textiles, and furniture collections available to the public via their website

RiverRun International Film Festival & Winston-Salem Symphony: \$10,000

To present Voices of Light, which merges Carl Dryer's legendary silent film, The Passion of Joan of Arc, with a live performance of composer Richard Einhorn's moving original score that fuses solo voices, chorus and orchestra

Terpsicorps Theatre of Dance: \$7,500

To premiere "The Raven," a multimedia contemporary ballet that includes original dance, music, sculpture and cutting edge projections at Hanesbrands Theatre at the Milton Rhodes Center for the Arts

University of North Carolina School of the Arts: \$10,000

To continue the "Winston-Salem Light Project," a multimedia and interactive public art presentation designed by UNCSA senior students, who digitally manipulate light and projected images and use the building facades of prominent downtown landmarks as the canvas
